and for sale (both black & white and color photography) will feature various West Point scenes shot during Hunter's last four years at West Point. Parades, cadet athletic events, everyday cadet life and West Point landscapes will be the main focus of the show.

The 30-year old native of Brownsville, Texas has often contributed to ASSEMBLY. Some examples of his work are the front covers of the October 89 and March 90 issues, and the back covers of the February 89 and January 90 issues, including various photos that have accompanied feature articles

(e.g. the Army-BC Emerald Isle Classic, Army-Navy games, Ronald Reagan visit, R-Day, graduations and the recent Soviet cadet visit featured in this issue).

Hunter was recently selected as the Military Sports Photojournalist of the Year by the US Military Sports Association and honored at an awards ceremony in Washington, DC. His work has appeared in *Sports Illustrated*, *Army Times*, *Soldiers* magazine, and local newspapers.

The show is open to the public Monday-Friday 9 a.m.-3 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday 1 p.m.-6 p.m.
